



## **EARTHSCAN WINS IVCA CLARION AWARD FOR BEST OVERALL PUBLISHING**

Earthscan won the *Best Overall Publishing* award in the book category of the IVCA (International Visual Communication Association) Clarion Awards last Friday.

The judging panel chose Earthscan for the award,

"To recognise the considerable achievement of one of the world's leading publishers of environmental, developmental and sustainability issues, in its 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary year."

This year's success follows on from that of Chris Goodall's *How to Live a Low-Carbon Life* (Earthscan, 2007) which won the IVCA Clarion Award for *Best Non-Fiction Book* last year.

Last night's award could not have come at a better time, as Earthscan this year celebrates its twentieth birthday and is hosting the 'Sustainability 2.0: Does Sustainability Need an Update?' panel debate tomorrow night at the Royal Society for the Arts.

Camilla Toulmin, Executive Director of the International Institute for the Environment and Development, commented on Earthscan's success, "In twenty years, Earthscan has given us the solid evidence and provoking insights that light the way to a more sustainable planet".
